

CAMPER CODE OF CONDUCT

Camp Meraki has implemented the following Camper Code of Conduct. All campers, CITs, Junior Counselors, and parents must read, understand and sign this form prior to the camper's participation at Camp Meraki.

By signing this form, the camper and parent both provide their consent that a camper who violates the Code of Conduct may be subject to disciplinary action by their counselor, in conjunction with Camp Meraki. This disciplinary action may include the forfeiture of the privilege to participate in Camp Meraki for the remainder of the session. We reserve the right to send campers who have violated the Camer Code of Conduct home.

- 1. No camper may use or have possession of any illegal drug, alcohol, cigarettes, or cigars while at Camp Meraki, either on camp property or any excursion outside of camp.
- 2. All medications, including over-the-counter medications and vitamins, must be kept with the camp nurse/physician. Inhalers, epi-pens, and other life sustaining items may be kept in the bunk if proper arrangements are made with the nurse/physician in advance.
- 3. Violent action to fellow campers, staff, animals, camp property, or to ones self is strictly prohibited. All participants in Camp Meraki, including staff, invited guests lecturers, campers, and parents agree to treat one another with respect while encouraging creativity.
- 4. Campers are prohibited from engaging in sexual activity or excessive displays of affection.
- 5. Campers agree not to deface or destroy camp property or other's personal property. Parents/campers will be held financially responsible for any damages.
- 6. For health and sanitation reasons Campers agree not to have food, candy, gum or soda in their cabins. Parents, friends, and relatives are encouraged to support this request by not sending packages with these items enclosed.
- 7. Campers must wear shoes at all times in the buildings and on camp grounds.
- 8. For safety reasons there are no firearms, fireworks, explosives, or knives allowed on camp grounds. If a camper is found with any of these items, it will be confiscated, officials will be notified, and parents will be summoned.
- 9. Campers agree to remain on camp property with the exception of regularly scheduled trips.
- 10. Campers agree to leave their cell phones at home. Time should instead be spent preparing scenes, songs, playing music, dancing, and making new friends. Cell phones will be confiscated.
- 11. Show respect for others: Our campers will respect the rights and feelings of the other participants. Fighting, bullying, name calling, intimidation, bigotry of any kind, inappropriate language or any other form of emotional or physical abuse or unwanted contact directed at one another, Directors, Counselors, Guest Artists, or Staff will not be tolerated.
